#### **Department of Public Works** Fall Leaf Pickup

Leaf vacuuming begins October 19 and runs until November 23 (early morning). Leaves must be placed as close to the street as possible, but NOT IN the street. Long narrow rows are preferable to big piles. If the leaves cannot be reached within a reasonable distance of the vacuum hose and truck, they will be left until they are raked closer to the street.

The Village purchased a new leaf vacuum this year so we will be more particular of other debris mixed in with the leaves such as rocks, walnuts, sticks and trash. Leaf piles mixed with debris that may cause damage to the leaf vacuum will be left until sorted.

**Brush pick up** – The last brush pick-up will be Tuesday morning, November 17. Brush left by the curbside after Nov. 17 will not be picked up.

#### Pet Waste

We appreciate your cooperation in picking up your pet waste! Residents with pets are responsible for cleanup of pet waste. Under no conditions will pet owners leave solid waste on ANY property other than their own. Please DO NOT deposit pet waste in Village trash cans. Solid pet waste is to be picked up immediately and removed from the area. There are no exceptions.

## Water & Sewer Notes

Our Sanitary Sewer system connects with the Plainwell system for waste treatment. Plainwell informed us that "flushable" wipes cause many problems in the system. They may be flushable but they do not degrade. Please refrain from flushing wipes.

#### **Hydrant Flush**

All fire hydrants will be flushed on October 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. If your water is discolored, let it run until it clears.

#### Skating Rink – Starting in December

The Martin Area Veterans and the Village of Martin are planning to put together the ice skating rink again this year, located behind the water tower. We have a tote full of donated skates that can be loaned out for use at the rink. You may check out a pair of skates during regular Village office hours or by making arrangements with the Clerk (text 269-650-0163).

During January and February, volunteers will be on hand every Saturday to hand out skates, starting at noon. PCI also issues electrical, mechanical, and plumbing permits for the village.
