Fall Leaf Pickup

Leaf vacuuming begins **October 21** and runs until **November 25** (early morning). Leaves must be placed as close to the street as possible, but **NOT** IN the street and not placed by poles, guy wires, hydrants, mailboxes or other obstructions. Long narrow rows are preferable to big piles. If the leaves cannot be reached within a reasonable distance of the vacuum hose and truck, they will be left until they are raked closer to the street. Leaves should be put out the evening before pickup. Once we go by your house, we will not backtrack. Other debris mixed in with the leaves such as rocks, walnuts, sticks and trash will cause damage to our equipment. Leaf piles mixed with debris will be left until sorted.

In Spring 2020 we prefer to **NO LONGER** pick up yard waste in **plastic bags**. <u>Please use paper bags</u>.

Brush pick up – The last brush pick-up will be Tuesday morning, **November 12**. **Brush left by the curbside after Nov. 12 will not be picked up.** Brush must be placed by the roadside the evening before pick up. No backtracking.

Remove your sale signs when your garage sale is over.

Do not use Elsie Street to clean out concrete trucks.

Snow Removal – Please do not push snow into the road or pile on the sidewalk. Also, if you do not have a curb and you want to ensure that the snow plow does not tear up any of the edge of your property,

<u>PLEASE use stakes to mark the edge</u> of your property. This will help our DPW maintain a clean roadway while also protecting your property.

Please DO NOT park in the road or the Water Tower parking lot at night during the winter as it makes it difficult to plow the roads. Continued from page 1

Residents contemplating the building of new structures, or making additions to existing buildings, should check their plans with Professional Code Inspectors (PCI), 1575 142nd St, Dorr, MI 49323, phone 616-877-2000, or have your builder do so before starting the project. PCI also issues electrical, mechanical, and plumbing permits for the village.

Water & Sewer Notes

Our Sanitary Sewer system connects with the Plainwell system for waste treatment. Plainwell informed us that "flushable" wipes cause many problems in the system. They may be flushable but they do not degrade. **DO NOT FLUSH WIPES, PLEASE.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

The Village is applying for a large loan in order to improve our sewer lift stations. The work is expected to occur in the summer of 2020. Sewer rates will unfortunately go up more than the usual annual increase. This is unfortunate but necessary. The Village will not increase rates any more than is necessary to help pay for these improvements.

Hydrant Flush

All fire hydrants will be flushed on **October 4**th and 5th · If your water is discolored, let it run until it is clear.
